

**RESEARCH ARTICLES AND INTERLIBRARY LOAN (ILL)**

**MEDICAL JOURNAL ARTICLES RESEARCH ON**



Most of you should be familiar with Sonoran University Library's **iSearch** search engine, specifically with relation to its use as a tool to search our various medical journal articles databases. **iSearch** will help you find some free full text articles, as well as provide only citations and abstracts for other articles. For the latter, **iSearch** provides a link to order full text articles using the Library's InterLibrary Loan (ILL) service. One of the most notable of the databases searchable with **iSearch** is PubMed, a significant medical journals articles database put together by the National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI), a branch of the National Library of Medicine. PubMed is a major source of over 35 million citations of the most scholarly and rigorously scientific medical and science journals around North America, and even around the world, dating back to 1948. Most include abstracts, and many may include links to the full text articles; but be aware that some of these links might require you to register and pay a fee with the publisher, but there are many that will be completely free as open access resources.


If you choose to use this database a lot, you should consider setting up a free NCBI account to help you track, save and organize routine searches, set up an 'Alert' system to be notified of particular new articles, and more. Click the "Sign In to NCBI" link in the very top right corner of the webpage to register to create an NCBI account.

## EVIDENCE-BASED MEDICINE – EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE A LIBRARY MYSONORAN PAGE OF INSTRUCTION & RESOURCES

One of the Library's MySonoran pages is an overview of *Evidence-Based Practice*, aka *Evidence-Based Medicine*, with links to instructional and other very informative information.

### **Definition:**

Evidence based practice (EBP) is the conscientious use of current best evidence in making decisions about patient care (Sackett, Straus, Richardson, Rosenberg, & Haynes, 2000).

*It is a problem solving approach to clinical practice and administrative issues that integrates:*

- A systematic search for and critical appraisal of the most relevant evidence to answer a burning clinical question
- One's own clinical expertise
- Patient preferences and values (Melnik & Fineout-Overholt, 2014)

The EBP process is a method that allows the practitioner to assess research, clinical guidelines, and other information resources based on high quality findings and apply the results to practice.
