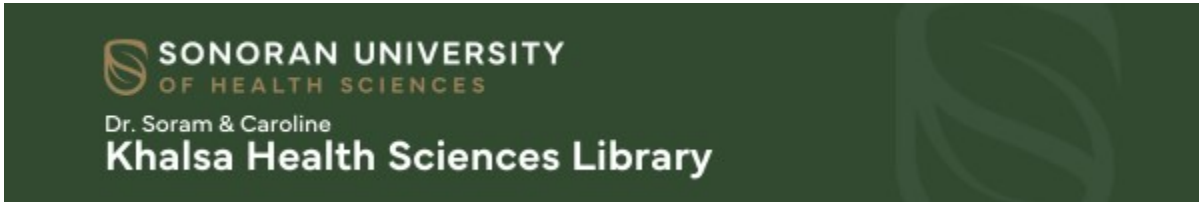

RECOMMENDED BROWSER

It is likely you have a preferred Internet Browser that you utilize daily. However, it is important to be aware that not all web browsers are created the same. And these differences can be significant in how they affect the functionality and appearance of websites. As a result, you may experience issues when accessing the Library's databases and other online resources depending on which Browser you regularly use. If you are having problems accessing the Library's databases and resources, you may wish to explore using a different Browser. The Library has found, and recommends, **Google Chrome** to be the most consistent overall in successfully utilizing the many various Library databases and online resources. Though not always the most popular, please consider using this particular Browser for the Sonoran Library resources.

Meanwhile, on occasion, you may still experience issues with accessing your Library account and databases. Some troubleshooting tips that the Library recommends can be related to any of your Browsers and their settings. Remember to regularly clear the Cache in your Browser. Regularly rebooting, closing and reopening, your Browser can also be significant. Additionally, sometimes you will need to turn on your Pop-Up feature. And sometimes, making sure your Browser is current can be a factor. Be sure that your computer is regularly successfully updating, and often just rebooting your computer completely can make a big difference.

Please consider and make sure to try all of these troubleshooting tips before contacting the Library about account and database access issues.

Business Source Complete, provided by EBSCO, is a premium database with full-text content and peer-reviewed business journals. This database is an essential tool for business students. It covers all disciplines of business, including marketing, management, accounting, banking, finance and more. There are more than 2,000 active full-text journals and magazines, with more than 1,200 active, full-text, peer-reviewed journals, 760 active, full-text, peer-reviewed journals with no embargo, and 830 active full-text journals indexed in Web of Science or Scopus.

!!! MISSED EXAMS & TESTING CENTER IN THE LIBRARY !!!

It is a reality that “Life Happens while you are busy making other plans”. Medical School is no different. It is understood that outside forces may prevent you from making it to a scheduled exam. In addition to the many functions of the Sonoran University Library, and among the various rooms and resources, the Library also has a Testing Center, which is utilized in conjunction with the Dean of Students Office, and the Accessibility Office, for those times when unforeseen events occur. As soon as possible (within 24 hours), before anything else, notify your Faculty **AND** the **Dean of Students** of your inability to attend class. This will dictate whether you will be allowed to Make-up an exam. Meanwhile, additionally, before or when an exam is missed, immediately contact the Dean of Students or Library Staff for information on the process and form to make up an exam. For any questions or clarification, please feel free to discuss or initiate the process with the Dean of Students or Library Manager. It is upon you to take the necessary action(s) to make-up a missed exam. LWW Health Library

The **LWW Health Library** is a subscription-based resource, produced by the Wolters Kluwer / Lippincott Williams & Wilkins publishing company, that features leading medical content, plus multimedia, self-assessment, algorithms, case studies, and more. Of course, here at Sonoran University, it is most popular for the wealth of Ebooks content. To be clear, understand that only a select few medical books published strictly by the LWW publishing company will be found in this particular Database.

On the Library's MySonoran site, you will find the link to the LWW Health Library first in the "A-Z List of Library Resources" on the "Library Resources Databases Holdings" page. Be sure to click on it to link out to the Library LWW account page. It will take you right to the LWW Library of Medical Textbooks, many of which are required and/or recommended for your Basic Sciences, CLPR and various other Sonoran University Courses.

Currently this site has over 5088 medical journal back-issues, organized by topic or alphabetical, there are also many journals in a variety of languages. Many are available as downloadable PDFs, and some are available as mobile apps. There is also an app for the site in general. Due to the library's limited hours and staffing, the library staff is more likely to be able to respond by e-mail at most any time in the order they are received; though delays may occur.
